

WCAG 2.0 at a Glance

Perceivable

- Provide **text alternatives** for non-text content.
- Provide **captions and alternatives** for audio and video content.
- Make content **adaptable**; and make it **available** to assistive technologies.
- Use **sufficient contrast** to make things easy to see and hear.

Operable

- Make all functionality **keyboard accessible**.
- Give users **enough time** to read and use content.
- Do not use content that causes **seizures**.
- Help users **navigate and find** content.

Understandable

- Make text **readable and understandable**.
- Make content appear and operate in **predictable** ways.
- Help users **avoid and correct mistakes**.

Robust

- Maximize **compatibility** with current and future technologies.
